

RESEARCH ON THE LAND CONSOLIDATION IMPLEMENTATION IN NAM DINH PROVINCE

Summary

On the basis of appreciation the role and importance of land consolidation in agricultural and rural development, during two periods of 2002-2004 and 2011-2015, Nam Dinh province has successfully implemented land consolidation. The results of land consolidation: the total number of public land plots in the province is quite high with 21,588 plots of which the most is in Hai Hau district (6,310 plots) and the lowest is in Nghia Hung district (1,266 plots). The average number of plots/household decreases, the province only has an average of 2.11 plots/household. In which, Vu Ban has the highest average of 2.88 plots/household, the lowest one is Nghia Hung with 1.46 plots/household. Studied results have shown: Land consolidation has created conditions for adjusting the field's shape, improving the on-farm traffic system, in-field irrigation, promoting production mechanization, applying synchronously technical advances in the field, improving the efficiency of the land use, towards a commodity agricultural production. From the studied results of land consolidation implementation in Nam Dinh, a coastal province in the Red River Delta, a number of lessons have been pointed out: the role of Party committees, authorities, mass organizations, religions, farmers, support resources on mechanisms, policy, finance,...
